The Business of Death in the Age of COVID-19

Chet Hitt, Owner of six mortuaries, including Sunset Hills Memorial Park & Mortuary, two cemeteries (*one owned*, *one managed*), Topock Bar and Restaurant, Apple Valley Farmer's Market, Townsend Distillery, and founder of Morning Sun Foundation among others, spoke to the Club on the business of death in the age of Coronavirus.



Recently he has purchased a new facility in Victorville that will become the largest morgue in the county, that can hold 250 bodies. Labeled kinder as a "Care Center", it currently houses around 98 bodies, with only 2 of them COVID-19 deaths, while 7 of them are from people who died due to not going to the hospital because they were afraid to leave their home because of the pandemic. Sadly, so far this year they have already surpassed 2019 suicide cases, and drug overdose related deaths are up 1.5% higher than last year.

Finally, 6 of their cases are from what Chet calls "Failure to Thrive", those, mostly elderly, who have lost their spouse, and then pass themselves within a two week time frame because they could not leave their homes and had no one to talk to. In 2019 their average takein was 2.8 bodies per day, but now in the age of COVID-19, they average 4.7 bodies a day.

Looking back at these numbers, Chet surmises, that people are dying from everything else but COVID-19. So far this year, his mortuaries have conducted 34 Covid funerals, and at the outset of the pandemic had to turn his chapel into a makeshift embalming room with 11 bodies in the chapel at one point.

One positive he gets out of this pandemic, is at his Topock Bar and Restaurant. Whenever Governor Gavin Newsom shuts California, more people come to his resort in Arizona and spend their money on booze and boating.

Recently he has gotten some slack for not enforcing a mask or social distancing policy at his Farmer's Market, but says it is not his job to police the visitors and is exempt by the State.

In the future Chet will open a new, 95-acre cemetery, but you can know that wherever you turn in Apple Valley, you will find something that has Chet Hitt's hands in it.
