

THE DELTA CONVEYANCE PROJECT

Tom McCarthy, General Manager of the Mojave Water Agency was at the podium to give us an update on the Delta Conveyance, formerly the California Water Fix.

The Mojave Water Agency (MWA) is just one of 29 State Water

Contractors working together to bring this project through to fruition to serve the increasing 27 million Californians. The project begins up Northern California in Lake Orville and travels down the center of California, before splitting

off to the Coastal Branch on the West side (Los Angeles) and the East Branch in Lake Perris. Another part of being a State Contractor; the MWA is also a wholesaler supplier of supplemental water to retail companies in the state.

The MWA has another function as Regional Water Managers. In this capacity they are regional planners, making sure there is a reliable water supply for the

long term, not just the near future, and to also ensure the health and sustainability of the ground water system.

In addition to all of this, they are also the State's Water Master, working and setting up controls on how all 29 State Water Contractors will share the water, manage the supply and the import of extra water from the North.

Of course, the MWA is also faced with many challenges. To name just a few, they must deal with many environmental challenges and impact studies on a project of this magnitude, which inevitably lead to lawsuits from different organizations which could delay the project. Along with this there is an increased demand for water in our State, so making this Conveyance a reality is more important than ever. To handle these challenges, they have received a lot of assistance and support from the latest California Governor Gavin Newsom.

The future looks bright for the Delta Conveyance but a lot of work still needs to be done. Tom and his staff at the MWA will continue to work with the State and other Contractors to figure out exactly how it will work, how they will share in the cost of this important water delivery system and how to adapt all of this to the current and future climate changes.


