BUSINESS OWNERS LEARN HOW TO AVOID POTENTIAL LAWSUITS

Victorville Rotarian Kevin Porter joined Sharon Page of The HR Edge to explain the many ramifications of protecting your small business against unscrupulous and/or disgruntled employees. The two perspectives combined to address issues business owners face in California in conducting their business. Two things are for sure: The laws are ever-changing and confusing, and California is extremely over-regulated!

Sharon shared some of the complexities in the Human Resource aspect of employment law regarding unique compensation, including telecommuting and exempt vs. non-exempt employees.

Kevin offered three common scenarios of terminated employees suing their past employer in Federal Court. Some of the most common filings include unpaid overtime, disallowed breaks, and unreimbursed mileage.

In summation, Sharon advises prevention. Communicate, communicate, communicate, and... document, document, document! Have your policies in place and updated regularly. Have an attorney or Human Resources professional review your Employee Handbook often.

Kevin advises an ounce of prevention, and states that in the law, the employer is guilty until proven innocent! He recommends you keep employee payroll records for four years; a Class Action lawsuit can hugely impact or completely ruin a small business.
