The Young Marines program at Excelsior started with just 35 kids, and has now grown to 87, due to the hard work and dedication of **Cindy Velasquez** and Senior training Officer, **Jason Becker**.

This program is NOT meant to be a gateway into joining the armed forces or a program for troubled youth only. It is a program to teach our young people respect, camaraderie. involvement and to inspire today's youth to be tomorrow's Neaders. Another bia aspect of this program is to help kids stay off the path of drug abuse. Their D.D.R. (Drug Demand Reduction) program is to keep kids off drugs, as well as teaching the consequences of using drugs. The most effective way to make the D.D.R. program work, is due to the fact that it is not run by adults... it is taught by the Senior Young Marines, teaching the Junior Young Marines!

Community Service is also a big part of the Young Marines. Some of their activities consist of Color Guard, laying wreaths, visiting veterans who are home bound and different community events throughout the year. The groups meet every other Saturday for 8 hours for drills and activities.

During Encampment time, the students learn to get out of the house and live life outdoors. At these encampments they are joined by other Young Marines groups from throughout California and once everyone is there, all kids are mixed in to other groups, to encourage friendship and communication. Actives such as repelling, swimming, obstacle course runs and more, take place over 3 days and is extremely beneficial to everyone.
