HAPPENINGS IN SACRAMENTO

On Patriot's Day this week, Rotarians were honored to hear from our State Assemblyman **Jay Obernolte**, who gave the attended members and guests and update on what is happening in the State Capital.

Along with being our Assemblyman, Jay is also the Vice Chairman of the Budget Committee that brings its own sets of challenges. This year the State actually had a surplus and the problem that accompanied it was whether to give it back to Californians, save it, or give more to existing programs.

In fact they did a little of all of everything with the \$9 Billion surplus. This year the BSA Reserve was fully funded. Funding has been increased 9% to schools and community colleges due to this.

Speaking on Bills passed, Jay spoke about SP100, which will make California 100% reliable on renewable energy by the year 2045. Jay is against this. He feels he owes it to constituents that the State needs to actually have a plan to do this. With more and more houses going to solar energy, we over generate energy during the day and under generate at night when people turn on their lights. In fact we make so much energy during the day, sometime we have to try and pay other states to take the extra energy! What we need is to build more energy storage units in California.

Jay also voted against a new Bill that will do away with monetary bail, which not only allow more people get away from being held accountable for misdemeanor crimes, but will in fact kill the Bail Industry altogether.

This year Jay shared that he did something that he will never do again. He has 15 Bills on the Governor's desk and it has been exhausting and taxing to him and his staff. Of the 15 Bills, 7 have been signed, one has been vetoed, and the rest are still on the Governor's desk.

His favorite Bill is still on Brown's desk, that he hopes will be signed. This Bill will eliminate the fee that Veterans have to pay to have their Branch Designation on their Driver's License, which gives them benefits. Jay suspects a battle, as the DMV will lose a big source of revenue and will fight tooth and nail to make sure it doesn't pass.

Our Country is divided right now and there is a lot of hatred on both sides, but rest assured that our Assemblyman **Jay Obernolte** is doing his best for Californians to work together regardless of party lines and make this State a better place for all.


LETNER'S LETTER


