Reading B4K - Ending Literacy Poverty



Read B4K is a project, that teaches 4 year old children the basics of sounding out letters, so when they enter kindergarten, they are already reading at a first grade level. **Brad Letner** spearheaded this outreach though our Club earlier this year and is now looking to make it bigger and better for 2017.

Studies have shown that students not reading at grade level by 3rd grade and four times more likely to drop out. Based on research and studies, early literacy combats poverty as adults. If a child is succeeding in 4th - 8th grade, they are more likely to graduate high school and have successful employment as adults.

While all the studies and facts mean a lot, I will share about the experience of "Read-B4K". Years ago, every Thursday morning I would volunteer to read to 1st graders at different schools in the High Desert. It was fun and rewarding, because I knew going in, that a lot of these children did not get read to at home. When I heard about this project through our Club, I jumped at the chance to volunteer. Working one-on-one with a child over a few

This whole experience is akin to the old adage: give a man a fish and you feed him for a day; teach a man to fish and you feed him for a lifetime.

Not one person does this alone, it takes many. While Brad oversaw and facilitated the project, along with others, **Margaret Cooker** was there almost every session working with these children. Other Rotarians such as **Caroll Yule**, **David North, Dan Munsey, Dr. Hough** and myself, were there working with these children as much as our schedules allowed. With the success of the six "graduating" students, it is time to grow the project to the next level.

The project needs more volunteers. Please consider giving one hour a week, an hour a month, or even as a stand-by. Anything would help. You can also give by helping with funds. This year we want to teach and give low income families that have computers, the software to empower them to teach their children at home. Each software program costs \$40. The project is also in need of \$100 a week to pay our volunteer coordinator, **Colleen Calderon** for her invaluable time running the program, making calls to families and volunteers. If you cannot do either, then all that is asked is to share this program with people you know. You never know which one of your friends or family will catch the passion for this project like some of us have, and continue to make this grow into something bigger than all of us.
