THE CRANIAL FACIAL RELEASE TECHNIQUE

Dr. Sara Griffin has been a Chiropractor for many years in the High Desert and with her company, Active Care Chiropractic, she handles some of the most extreme cases, which she shared with the Club this week. As a muscular/skeletal specialist, she talked about a procedure that is not accepted by the medical community, insurance industry, and not even fully accepted by the Chiropractic community, the Cranial Facial Release Technique. Cranial Facial Release (CFR) is a chiropractic adjustment technique that re-establishes the flow of the cerebral spinal fluid to the brain and spinal column.



To understand how CFR works, it is important to realize that the skull is NOT one solid bone. It is made up of 22 individual bones that actually move every time you breathe – or at least they are supposed to. But cranial fixations are a common occurrence and often times the root cause of many chronic neurological conditions and recurrent pain syndromes that don't respond to conventional chiropractic adjusting procedures.

It is great for those who suffer from sleep apnea, and helps open up breathing passages and with it snoring goes down significantly.

CFR also helps blood flow through the brain, those with thyroid conditions, pain relief, hearing loss and can even help people get rid of those pesky reading glasses. Of course, CFR is not directed to be used in the treatment of the issues mentioned above, but can be the result of doing the technique.

It is a very fast procedure and feels similar to the sensation of jumping into a swimming pool and having water shoot up your nose – it isn't exactly painful, but not the most comfortable sensation either – but it's quick! The whole process takes about 2 to 3 seconds, and is performed in a series of 4 individual days of treatment over a 7-10 day period.

The majority of people who come in for CFR treatment are often last resort patients who have been through the gamut of conventional medical procedures without success, and are looking for a more conservative alternative approach to care that is cost effective and works!

CFR is an advanced endo-nasal "Balloon Assisted" cranial adjusting technique that has been used quite successfully in the treatment of various neurological and structural disorders. The objective of CFR technique is to unlock cranial fixations and induce mobility in the cranial system - primarily targeting the sphenoid bone, with the purpose of facilitating normal cranial respiratory motion and normal cranial function. This technique is performed by inserting tiny balloons in the nose that are quickly inflated to mobilize the bones of the face and cranium.
