MASTER PLAN: FOCUS ON THE WHOLE CHILD

Dr. Ron Williams Ed.D who is the Superintendent of the award winning Victor Valley Union High School District, spoke to the Club this week on their 2020-2030 Master Plan. The District serves around 11,000 students in grades seven through twelve with nearly 1,000 staff members.

The goal of the Master Plan over the next 10 years is to provide world class education for its students, preparing them for postsecondary education, preparing a workforce for the growing aerospace-technology plus other industries in the region, and finally to develop community members who will

contribute positively to the quality of life in the Mojave High Desert Region of San Bernardino County.

The Education Master Plan has four key areas of focus, with the first being *Student Success*. This refers to the fulfillment of the VVUHSD Mission and successful academic, career readiness and social outcomes for students. The next goal is *Organizational Effectiveness*. This refers to an efficient and effective administration and operations of the District, run as a business and an educational institution. Third is *Educational Workforce Development and*

Effectiveness. This area focuses on the recruitment, hiring, training, advancement and retention of highly qualified, diverse instructional leaders, faculty and staff to enhance district capacity for excellence in all areas. The final area of focus is *Community Partnership and Service*. This refers to providing leadership and working in alliance with other businesses, institutions, agencies and organizations for the advancement and benefit of the communities and region we serve.

In the current school year 2021-2022, four programs will be starting up this

year. These include an Aviation Pathway Program, a Legal Pathway Program, a Medical Pathway Program and a Middle College Program. The Middle College Program will be taught between Lakeview Leadership Academy and Victor Valley College. The Legal Academy will be at University Prep, while a Public Safety Academy will be taught at Adelanto High School.



Next to speak was **Dr. Antoine Hawkins**, who spoke about the continuing food service with the VVUHSD. Quite simply, every child eats for free. They had some logistic issues during the height of the pandemic, but they kept it moving. He also shared information on how

every child who needed a Chromebook and a wifi hotspot, received them.
