

## **Manufacturing in the High Desert**



Jim Dye, General Manager, United Furniture Industries, Inc.

The site of the old George Air Force Base is California's home to United Furniture Industries, Inc., with six additional manufacturing locations in Mississippi and North Carolina (three in each state). General Manager Jim Dye is a transplant from Mississippi/Tennessee/Carolina, now feels like a current "native" Californian. He loves it here, and plans to stay.

Jim values the importance of "community" in business, and is proud to hire locally; 27 families moved up from down below to work in the Victorville plant, and there are 200 employees in total. The nine million dollar annual payroll allows his workers to spend their earnings in the High Desert, and Jim stated that his company impacts the local economy with over \$30 million being spent on goods and services locally. The company ships under the United Furniture brand name, and also Simmons Upholstery. Jim explained how instituting payroll incentives has almost doubled many employees' hourly rates, as well as product output. He stated that Victorville is now the most efficient of all the United Furniture Ind. plants, with 1,000 pieces per day being manufactured. We
