## **JOB CREATION TRAINING PROGRAM**

This week's guest speaker was Theresa Franke, 2011-12 Rotary Club of Chino President, who jointly presented with C. Ray Carlson, President of Entrepreneurial Media Consortium, Inc. The topic was a project entitled, "Beyond Apple", and was conceived by C. Ray Carlson, who is also the District 5300 Vocational Chair. Ray's goal through "Beyond Apple" is to use business-savvy Rotarians to help guide students into entrepreneurship, starting with writing a business plan. The program is 20 years old, and "Job Creation for Youth is our Mission". It has been used in Nigeria to help students create their own business, and Ray has returned four times with his program.

The 10-week program is directed toward high school students, and Theresa, with the help of the Chino Rotary Club, brought it into the Chino High School. Theresa explained how they started with volunteers, coordination, training, and a budget. Five Rotarians began to implement the program utilizing their business knowledge as a basis, with funds budgeted from the Club's Foundation. They worked with the students to develop a business plan. At the end of the class, one group's plan was selected to be presented to the Chino Rotary Club.

your monthly ROTARIAN magazine just above your Name, or you can get it from MargaretCooker). Just click VIEW My DATA (under the MEMBER tab), and then you may EDIT/change "your information", including the User I.D. and Password to values of your choice.


ready have a \$3,000 commitment from the Superintendent of the Oro Grande School District!
