

Jim Cox, Retired Victorville City Manager Addresses Rotary



Introduced by Mike Page, Jim Cox presented us with some insights that he now can discuss as "retired" City Manager of Victorville. James L. Cox began his tenure with the City of Victorville as an Assistant City Manager in 1967-69. He was appointed City Manager for the City of Victorville in December1969 and continued as City Manager until his retirement in 1999. In 2009, he was asked to return to his post. He stated that in the state of California, there are only 460 City Managers... a very limited number of people.

Jim said he would like to "Explain some history as I would like it to be written". He told some interesting and humorous stories about incidents that occurred during his long association with the city, including how he sometimes received phone calls at all hours of the night for various reasons. He spoke about "audits" of the city and the difficulty in setting a "value" to George Air Force Base going back to 1940.

Jim has always taken pride that the City of Victorville is one of the cleanest run governments. As he stated to the Grand Jury,

"If I find wrongdoing, I am going to report it". Jim was recently asked how he would balance the budget if he were involved in the federal government. His answer... "The key is not to increase fees and not increase taxes, especially at the time of a recession, but to encourage spending". Jim believes in a "team concept", and feels there is a great team working for Victorville. He has a goal of continuing to keep Victorville's reputation "positive" so as to continue to attract business. Thank you, Jim, for the very interesting presentation!

President Charles announced that, if we hadn't noticed, the Grumpy Golfer is serving up some variety. This week's specialty was a "taco bar", quite yummy.


