SANBAG - Governments Working Together



San Bernardino Associated Governments (SANBAG) is an association of local San Bernardino County governments. It is the metropolitan planning organization for the county, with policy makers consisting of mayors, council members, and county supervisors, and the funding agency for the county's transit systems. Dr. Ray Wolfe became the Executive Director of SANBAG in April of 2012, after spending more than 20 years with CalTrans. He holds degrees in the fields of mechanical and civil engineering. He is grateful to the voters who twice approved Measure I sales tax, through which the projects featured in his Power Point presentation are funded.

The presentation reviewed a few of these projects which directly affect our high desert. The Mesa/Nisqually Interchange opened August 13, 2014. The "infamous" Ranchero Bridge Overpass should be open by December 14th

(and has been a thorn in Dr. Wolfe's side since the bridge fire May 15th). There is reconfiguration being done at the Devore junction of the I-15 and the I-215, which should fix the problem of slow merging trucks. Other projects Dr. Wolfe discussed included the Highway 395 widening, the Yucca Loma Bridge, and the Cajon Pass rehabilitation project.

Dr. Wolfe spent a moment on the High Desert Corridor project, stating one of the positives would be alternative uses that exist through that corridor. We thank Dr. Wolfe for his time and answering questions from the audience.


