Our new San Bernardino County DA **Jason Anderson** readily admits that we pay his salary, so one of his job duties is to listen to the tax payers. It is that mindset that has given him the mission to return the D.A.'s office to a place of service and accountability.

In his nine months as D.A., Jason has first been listening to his colleagues. He wants the office, made up of attorneys, staff, investigators and more, to know that they are valued and uses this to find out why they choose to come to work each day, using their strengths for the betterment of the public.

In terms of the public, one of their new programs is the

Community Commission, where 13 people if different economic and ethnic backgrounds meet with Jason to discuss if a person should be convicted, if excessive force was used, and the Justice System itself. In

fact, one of the publics biggest issues is not understanding how the Courts system really works. Their first meeting was 5 hours long and these members of the public received a class in Justice 101, learning about the roles of prosecutors, defense attorneys and judges. People walked away from

the meeting with a much better understanding of the system. Their next meeting in November will cover Officer Involved Shootings. In 2020 they are looking to grow the group from 13 to 60 members and meet every quarter, to discuss not only differences, but solutions as well to make our streets better and safer.

In 2020, the D.A.'s office for the first time is putting together an Officer Involved Shooting Team! Their office has the responsibility in reviewing all cases of this nature, and will now be sending out a team to the actual scene of the incident to investigate, not after the fact.

A recurring issue in the County is the revolving door of homelessness and mental health issues. Jason has partnered with the Defenders' Office, Law Enforcement and Mental Health Professionals and meet every month, called the Law & Justice Group to work on tackling these issues. In this group, they have begun a Mental Health Diversion Campaign, to assist capable mental health sufferers start a new life and not commit any more crimes. The group relies on the collaboration of its member agencies to reach a common goal of providing help, but also a fair, just and efficient judicial process, and to develop solutions to problems of mutual interest.

The San Bernardino County District Attorney's Office represents the interests of the People in the criminal justice system. Your District Attorney's Office serves the residents by ensuring justice with excellence, integrity and compassion by transparently partnering with the public, law enforcement, and the judiciary; stewarding public resources to hold the guilty accountable, support victims of crime, and honoring the humanity of all involved in the criminal justice system; restoring a culture of service and accountability to the most powerful law office in the County whose singular mission will be to restore systems and people to provide equal justice for all.
