District Governor Doug Fowler greets Victorville Rotarians

District Governor Doug Fowler paid his official visit to the Rotary Club of Victorville, saying that if he doesn't know each of us, he knows OF us. A short bio: Doug's banking career of almost 34 years included 14 years in San Diego County before relocating to the High Desert in 1989. Doug has been an active member of the Rotary Club of Apple Valley since 1995. In his tenure with the Rotary Club of Apple Valley, he has filled many leadership roles, including Club President and Rotarian of the Year in both 2000 and 2004. Doug started the Teacher Mini-Grant program for the Rotary Club of Apple Valley and has spearheaded Apple Valley's co-sponsorship in matching grants to Mexico and Turkey. His

wife, Deborah, is an elementary school of Victor Valley Sunrise.

Doug describes Rotary as a "multi-faceted organization with many ways to contribute for a better global impact". He emphasized some of International Rotary President Kalyan Banerjee's Rotary goals: His first priority in Rotary is family, and secondly, to "exer-

cise continuity". He wants to see Rotary do bigger, better, and bolder projects. "We need to build on our successful projects, and expand upon them to reach more people in the future."

Doug is proud to be part of the Rotary Zone that is ranked #1 in the World for Polio Contributions, and #2 for Total Contributions! Rotary projects of interest to Doug include the Wheelchair Project, "This Close" (Polio eradication), GSE, and Rotoplast. He encourages members to attend this year's District Conference, which will be held at the newly renovated Lake Arrowhead Resort.
