Caroll Yule Updates Rotary on Today's Real Estate Market


Past President Russ introduced guests this week. We welcomed Linda Reuter, Principal, Sixth Street Prep; Marie Langley of Choice Medical Group and Robin

Cackler and Lucy Winston of Life Church (Earle); Catherine Cassity of Gentiva Hospice (Hennessy); and Bobby Tarango of Chicago Title (Yule). Sitting in for members were Holly Noel (Heaston); Manny Manahan (Hampton); and Eugene Everage (Hough). Welcome! Fellow Rotarian Caroll Yule's reports on the market are always interesting and witty. As volatile as other markets have been recently, the housing market is on a very slow rise... a very slow rise, but rising it is.

In recent quarters, Inland Empire sales volume has been essentially flat because supply has been inhibited by investor purchases and homeowners with little equity, while demand has been hurt by buyer fears, high FICO score requirements and low appraisals.

Caroll offers these statistics: Of homes sold since January 1, 2014, 70% were valued over \$200,000; 28% valued between \$200 - \$400,000; and only 2% of sales were for homes over \$400,000.

Caroll introduced Bob Tarango of Chicago Title, commending he and his wife, Stacey (owners of Escrow Junction), for preparing The Market Condition Report for realtors in the Victor Valley. The MCR chart below shows the Inland Empire median price of only \$175,000, compared to the state's median home sale price of \$482,000.
