"When the Prisoner Works, So Does the System"



Richard Ives has been with the U.S. Department of Justice since 1986, and returned to the Rotary Club of Victorville to share his goals for the prisons he controls. He brought a Power Point Program which dramatized a civil war battle in 1863 whereby a last ditch effort was made to overtake the enemy using bayonets. This advance turned the tide, and made the difference. Warden Ives is also out to make a difference within the prison system he commands.

Within his complex, Warden Ives has 5,000 offenders and 1,000 staff members, all encompassed in a city within itself. There is a hospital, a school, even a Chief of Police. The inmates do all the painting, meal cooking, cleaning, etc., under a pay scale that starts at 12 cents an hour.

As much as possible, Ives tells us, low level criminals can be rehabilitated, taught skills, and returned to a useful life within the main population upon completion of their sentence. Inmates can learn computer skills, receive food han-

dling certifications, even earn college degrees while serving time.

There are many program that assist inmates with developing vital skills necessary to prepare them for successful re-entry to society upon their release. Warden Ives explained how nonprofit groups can utilize labor services through a parnership formed in some prisons with "Unicorp" (a private entity). Lower level inmates are allowed to work building or assembling items under certain conditions of this program, being paid for their labor. We thank Warden Ives for returning to Rotary to share his vision for rehabilitation of inmates.
