VICTORVILLE'S 50THANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION

City Manager Doug Robertson wrestled with two malfunctioning laptop computers and a very sensitive Green Tree Video system this week attempting to share the Victorville's 50th Anniversary Celebration video. With his usual aplomb, Doug handled the situation, and instead, took questions from his fellow Rotarians on a variety of subjects relating to the Redevelopment Agency, pension reform, revenue streams, High Speed Train project, Yucca Loma Bridge plans, and the WalMart project. Doug hopes at some point to successfully share the Celebration video with the Rotary Club of Victorville, and there's a chance it may be available on the City's web site.


A brief summary of what the video entails is as follows:

The community of Victorville was incorporated on September

21, 1962, and prior to incorporation the community had a history which goes back over 100 years, when the first settlers of European descent arrived. In about 1885, the community was known as Victor, named after Jacob Nash Victor. In 1901, the community's name was changed by the United States Post Office to "Victorville" due to the confusion associated with the community of Victor, Colorado. In 1926, U.S. Route 66 was established. A portion of this famous highway provided a transportation corridor through Victorville. 7th St. and "D" St. were a part of this national highway.

During World War II, on July 23, 1941, initial construction of Victorville Army Airfield, later renamed George Air Force Base, began. The base was completed May 18, 1943, and employed approximately 6,000 civilian and military personnel. On January 5, 1989, the Secretary of Defense announced the closure of George Air Force Base. The former military base was annexed into the City July 21, 1993, and has been renamed Southern California Logistics Airport

More recently, Victorville has experienced growing pains and a sagging economy; however, we see a very bright future. Thanks, Doug, for taking the time to inform Rotary of the workings of the City of Victorville from your position.
