SAVING SMILES...SAVING LIVES

Roger Schulte personally witnessed the humanitarian results of Rotaplast, a nonprofit organization through

which Rotarians and volunteers provide reconstruction surgeries and treatments to children with cleft lips, cleft palates and related anomalies.

Roger has been a member of the Rotary Club of Upland since 1978 and was president in 1984-85. He has chaired numerous district committees including RYLA, Teen Leadership Camp, Interact Symposium, and the Rotary Foundation Dinner. He served as our district governor in 2010-11.

He is currently the chair of the District Rotaplast Committee.

Rotaplast was started in San Fransisco over 26 years ago by Rotarians and has grown into a non-profit organization that goes on 12-15, two-week missions per year. Funds for these trips mainly come from Club and District Donations. A Rotaplast team is made up of Rotarians from the United States, as well as local Rotarians, from whatever Country they are in. Recently at the Guatemala trip, the local club got the word out by going to village to village, speaking with

Serving on a medical mission to Retalhuleu, Guatemala, people one-on-one. Along with the team are medical staff, as well as non medical staff.

In Guatemala, hundreds of people came out for help and

many of them were served. The doctors for these missions are top of the line, not people fresh out of medical school. The same applies for the Anesthesiologists and Nurses who take part. There is also a Quartermaster, who is in charge of getting equipment in and out of the country as well as a photo journalist, who writes a daily blog about the mission.

In one 90 minute operation, a child's life is changed forever. In these countries, a child with a cleft lip or palette is considered an outcast, demon possessed or cursed. Rotarians with Rotaplast, give them back their lives and their futures. One Guatemalan woman described the doctors as having "miracle hands".

The next trip through District 5300 is scheduled for June 9-23, 2019 where they will go to Arusha, Tanzania. They will be taking a full team of over 32 staff members and will do cleft lip and palette surgery, Maxillofacial surgeries as well as burn scar repair. The amount of \$60,000 needs to be raised to allow them to do their full mission in Tanzania. Rotaplast is looking for Club and individual contributions, as well as non-medical volunteers.


LETNER'S LETTER
