SHE IS SUFFERING, BUT HELP IS COMING

The victims of rape, molestation and other sexual assaults have a long road of recovery. After an assault is reported, one of the biggest challenges for law enforcement are the forensic/medical exams. This week, the Club was joined by San Bernardino Sheriff Captain **John**



Wickum and Providence St. Mary Philanthropy Officer **Nicole Orr** to speak on the Sexual Assault Response Team (S.A.R.T.).

For these victims, once a Deputy makes contact, the individual is taken off site to the station to give a full report, so officers can begin their investigation at the crime scene. In the past, the next step are for the victim must go for a forensic/medical examination. The closest locations have been Kaiser Medical Centers in Fontana or Redlands. While some people drive themselves or have a loved one assist, the Sheriff Department will provide drop off transportation 24 hours a day to a facility. While the exam takes place, their clothing is used for DNA, and many are left at the end with only a hospital gown, and no way to get home. With the need for sophisticated forensic and examination equipment, skilled and specifically trained medical personnel, the need for local help is apparent, that is where Providence St. Mary comes into the picture.

With over 100 rapes reported each year and only 5-20 actually reported, plus even less resulting in apprehension and conviction, the need for health care professionals, victim advocates, local social services and law enforcement to work together. Currently, the Assistance League of the Victor Valley provides

clothing for victims after their Kaiser exam, but much more is needed. Current obstacles facing victims are the shame, stigma, location of services and access to local care, removal (or amelioration) of which will result in more reporting, investigating and convictions.

Next year, a new Sexual Assault Response Facility with open up at Providence St. Mary in Apple Valley. Still on campus, but away from the hospital/emergency room in its own private facility, the building will host nurses with specialized training as Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners. The facility will include the latest equipment that will not only be used to prove the validity of the claim, but also used for suspects, as a way to gather DNA.

Another large portion of this will be community education to help some of the under reported 63% of sexual assault victims gain the strength to finally come forward. For those who have not reported the assault to the police, they can still arrive at the Providence St. Mary facility and receive service.

Rotarians and members of the community can help too by becoming engaged in support of the effort with Providence St. Mary plus other partners in the region, working with victims and survivors. Finally, one of the best ways to help is to communicate. Please let family, neighbors, friends and loved ones know that the Sexual Assault Response Team and Facility exists and help is out there. If you, or someone you know, has been a victim of sexual assault, rape, molestation ect, help is out there ...locally.
