



The Rotary Club of Victorville hosted a panel of community leaders involved in re-engineering the high desert workforce through a program called "STEAM". The panel was hosted by Dale Marsden, Superintendent of the Victor Elementary School District, who stated the goal is to ensure we have a better prepared work force.

The website states, "The Alliance for Education is a partnership among business, labor, government, community, and education in San Bernardino County." These entities are working toward ... "developing comprehensive programs related to Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics (STEAM) within San Bernardino County schools that will increase student participation in post-secondary education and/or training."

Each panelist had the opportunity to speak to how the program relates to their particular area of expertise. County Superintendent of Schools Dr. Gary Thomas tells us that our students are not recognizing the need to be educated beyond high school, and this program provides relevance and stimulation in math and science, particularly. The high paying jobs in our future are related to STEAM. Mayor McEachron tells us we are looking at ramping up an additional 400 jobs in the next two years due to the increase in corporations locating in our area. Colonel Ermer and Craig Garrick both stressed the importance of this program to facilitate available job creation at SCLA.

Alliance for Education will strengthen a standards-based, curriculum through relevant, hands-on learning opportunities provided by business, labor, and community partnerships. We thank our panelists for embracing this program and sharing their views with our Rotary Club.
