A CAREER PATH TO SUCCESS!


If you think of Victor Valley College as one large campus, you'd be right...and wrong. Although under the umbrella of VVC, the College is now made up of four different schools, each with its own administration staff and departments. These schools include Business Law & Academics, Humanities Arts



& Social Sciences, Science Technology Engineering & Math and Public Safety & Industrial Technology. This week **McKenzie Tarango**, Dean of Public Safety & Industrial Technology and **Frank Castanos**, Director of Community & Contract Education, shared the latter specialized and unique school from Victor Valley College.

The benefit of having four different schools is that they can now focus better on career education; not only preparing students to enter the workforce of their choosing, but also advance the skills of those already in a field of expertise. Once a career path is selected, a student's course may be taught the VVC main campus, Southern California Logistics Airport (SCLA), the Regional Public Safety Training Center in Apple Valley or at any number of local businesses. The School offers more than just lectures and labs, but

certification courses, credit courses, non-credit courses, job shadowing and more.

There are many different forms of career education which includes Credit Programs (Standard Community College learning to obtain a Degree), Non-Credit (free education, minus materials and fees), Cooperative Education

(workplace learning), Job Development (preparing resumes, mock interviews, etc.), Contract Education (customized, upscale training a business pays for their staff), Fee-Based Education (additional company training, paid for by the employee), and Apprenticeships (focus on the individual to elevate skills).

The Public Safety and Industrial Technology School offers courses and certified training in Automotive, Aviation Technology, Construction, Criminal Justice, Emergency Medical Services, Fire, Manufacturing, and Welding.

Working with local businesses has made this course model of teaching very successful. A great example shared was within the Automotive Dealership Technician course. Victor Valley College works in tandem with Victor Motors and Greiner Buick GMC, where the course is taught on the job, with paid internships. Once a student fully completes the course, they also receive their own set of tools!

For those who like to work with their hands, but have not made a career choice just yet, the Construction Department has an Apprenticeship Readiness program, where the students build a
