*Profit driven competition & innovation in the mortgage industry, & the proliferation of financing alternatives to

better fit individual borrowers, gave us the no employment, no income, no asset, no down payment, weak credit history mortgage financing collapse that we are still recovering from. *Fannie & Freddie are popularly portrayed as the villains that perpetrated the mortgage meltdown, when in fact they were simply the playing field. With investment banks in the skilled positions, lenders on the line & our political leaders coaching from the sidelines, private sector competition & innovation in the mortgage industry is the villain that led to the collapse. Remember Fannie & Freddie purchase & securitize mortgage loans from banks & mortgage lenders, essentially creating the secondary market space for Mortgage backed Securities (MBS).


