## **DCB - FROM FAILURE TO SUCCESS**

Rotarian Ron Wilson's 40 years in the banking industry are now behind him, and he adamantly states he'll never return! He does, however, possess two qualifications for working in banking: gray hair (for the distinguished look) and eyeglasses (for the intelligent look).

Ron began his career with DCB in 1989, when the bank had problem assets, resulting in poor employee morale and a bad reputation for the bank. In the first nine years of DCB's existence, they had five Presidents, five Chief Financial Officers, and nine Chief Credit Officers... and this was when the economy was good! "But there was no continuity with that kind of turnover. DCB's credibility was so bad that local merchants refused to take checks drawn on a DCB account!"

Ron's management direction was to rid the bank of major problem loans which were poorly underwritten. He also implemented a number of new policies and procedures. In the years of 1989-1998, when the rest of the economy suffered, DCB held its own. Ron wrote a weekly column for the Daily Press, "Money Matters", which was very popular, and implemented the Marquee Sign and Scoreboard program, giving DCB credibility and an important presence in the community.

We are lucky to have Ron back after his five-year absence. The Daily Press' "Most Influential Businessman of the Year" now operates Volunteer Business Services, offering no-charge assistance in business management.

The scholarships sponsor undergraduate and graduate students, as well as qualified professionals pursuing vocational studies. While abroad, scholars serve as goodwill ambassadors to the country where they study and give presentations about their own culture to Rotary clubs and other groups. Back home, scholars share with Rotarians and others the experiences that deepened their understanding of another culture.

Through their generous contributions, Rotarians worldwide show a continued faith that today's scholars will be tomorrow's community and world leaders.
