Preparing Students to be Successful Adults



Dr. Hough introduced two great presenters at Excelsior's Main Campus. First the Principal of Excelsior, Jamie Lowe followed by Minda Stackelhouse reviewed how they prepare the 1,356 students to be successful adults with the help of

partnering organizations such as Brandman University and Victor Valley College that allow the students to experience concurrent enrollment. This allows the student to

gain BOTH High School & College credits as well as explore different courses in order to determine which Major is the best option.

What's The Future?

A major goal of the Excelsior Education Center is to impove the current 12% Victor Valley population that has a four year college education to be closer to the State's 30% - a pretty poor showing for the High Desert! We caught a glimpse of the classes the students experience as we were divided into small groups and toured the campus with 3 student hosts per group. The editor's group visited a facilitators' room; Dance where they were just starting a recital piece; Guitar Class; Band Room; Acting-the first step to Drama; and the testing room which doubles as the library. Everyone enjoyed the campus and the tour. Many thanks Dr. Hough for arranging this for us.
