WHEN WILL WE RUN OUT OF WATER?

This week the Club was pleased to receive a visit from **Tony Winkel**, the Principal Hydrogeoligist from the Mojave Water Agency. Tony lives for water and is as equally passionate about MWA's continuing mission to collaboratively manage groundwater basins sustainably, import water responsibly, and address risks proactively using sound science and to achieve sustainable water management to empower our communities to thrive for generations to come.

Tony shared that most water on the earth is not fresh drinking water. Only 2.5 - 3% of the planet's water supply is fresh and out of that, less than 1% is available

to us! This makes water a very precious commodity.

Tony's specialty is groundwater basins and watersheds. A groundwater basin is defined as an area underlain by permeable materials capable of furnishing a significant supply of groundwater to wells or storing a significant amount of water. A groundwater basin is three-dimensional and includes both the surface extent and all of the

subsurface freshwater yielding material. A watershed is a land's surface area that contributes to the drainage or catchment area above a specific point on a stream or river.

The Mojave River runs from the San Bernardino Mountains, moving north past Barstow and ends just north of Baker, CA. Even though the river is dry, we know that it actually flows deep underground. On average, the river runs above ground once every ten years, as the water saturates underground and will be visible above ground during a particular rainy season. The last decent storm was in 2011.

Groundwater is unsaturated water. To assist

this there is a groundwater recharge, done two different ways. One way is for natural storms to recharge and make the river flow, and the other way is MWA buying water from the Morongo Basin Pipeline.

Our current drought is the worst. A drought normally last 30 years; we are now hitting the 20 year mark, so we could easily continue for another decade. With that being said, we are not running out of water. Measured water levels show we have had no significant change in our area. While our levels are low, we are not going to run out. We also are not to be gluttonous either. Be assured that the MWA is continuously working to increase our understanding of our precious water supply.
