It's been quite a journey for **Pastor Paul Earle** and his wife, **Charmaine Earle**, **M.D.**, as they spoke this week with the Club. They shared their story through ministry, management and medicine.

Pastor Paul was born in Jamaica, as the last of 14 children. In 1985, when he was 14 years old, he met Charmaine, who was a year younger, and they never looked back. After courting Charmaine for 7 years, he began his ministry in 1994. Paul had already begun to have a career in marketing management when God called him into ministry. The transition between marketing and ministry came about very easy as both seemed quite similar. First though, they had to do a "sell-off", meaning they had to sell off their expensive cars and possessions to begin ministry strictly through Faith.

Two years later, Charmaine's burgeoning medical career brought them to the United States, more specifically Pasadena. Charmaine did her residency at USC, while Paul began a Multi-Ethnic Church in Cerritos, CA. His church not only preached in English, but Mandarin, Korean, and Spanish.

Now comes their move to the High Desert. Charmaine was about to finish her Residency and was beginning to get invitations from hospitals and medical groups to interview with. She did not want to spend her time working in Emergency Rooms, as her desire was to be in Family Practice. Talking with Paul, they decided to do a practice interview with one such company, in a place they had no desire to live, especially after seeing it, the High Desert.

She interviewed with High Desert Primary Care, but weren't feeling it, so they decided to pray about it over a month's time. During this time, Paul was on a missionary trip in Honduras, and heard a calling from the Lord, "A Harvest is coming to the Desert, go raise up workers for the Harvest". At first Paul tried to ignore it, but the words kept calling him. Charmaine shared that if this is where the Lord was calling them, or anywhere else, then and now, she would follow.

Paul promised her wherever she worked, that was where they would live, and so by God's calling, she took the job and they moved to the High Desert, while Paul started a small Bible Study here and drove to the church in Cerritos to conduct services and baptize those who accepted Christ. One day at the intersection of Palmdale Road and Hwy 395, Paul heard the call to start a church, and Life Church was born.

For Paul and Charmaine Earle, their relationship with the Lord is central to their whole lives, and both of them care about our community, love what they do and put all their energies to heal the sick, and make workers for the Harvest. Currently Charmaine, a Best of the Desert winner three years in a row, is a Family Practice Physician at 12984 Hesperia Road in Victorville.
