Should I Go to Urgent Care or the Emergency Room?

In the emergency department at Desert Valley Hospital, Dr. Pascal not only has to treat patients, but also determine who needs help the quickest and who should really be at an urgent care facility. If you have a life threatening situation, such as chest pain or a sudden and severe pain, the emergency department is the only option. If you have a less serious situation BUT need immediate attention, that an urgent care facility is the best option.

Both work a bit differently from each other. An emergency room takes anyone, whether they have health insurance or not, but urgent care departments can turn you away if you don't have insurance or if your insurance isn't covered at that facility. It's is imperative that you know where the nearest urgent care is to you, that accepts your insurance and has hours that work for you and your family.

You need to go to an emergency room if you have the following conditions: chest pain, difficulty breathing, severe bleeding or head trauma, loss of consciousness and sudden loss or blurred vision. Urgent care facilities are the place to go if your regular physician is closed or cannot get you in for immediate help. Most urgent care centers are open



for extended hours and some on weekends. An urgent care center will best meet your needs is you have minor burns or injuries, sprains and strains, ear infections, non life-threatening allergic reactions, fever or flu-like symptoms, rash or other skin irritations, mild asthma, animal bites or broken bones.

Urgent care facilities will usually cost you less and will often have a much shorter wait times than an emergency room. It may cost you hundreds for a visit to the emergency room, and if you go to an emergency room with an urgent care need, you may be waiting many hours to be seen. They are also a great resource for flu shots and physicals for sports or schools.

Desert Valley Medical Group has urgent care centers at the following locations: 16850 Bear Valley Road in Victorville, 17450 Main Street in Hesperia and 11499 Bartlett in Adelanto.
