THE RETURN OF THE GRIZ...

Local historian **David** "Old Town **Griz" Drylie** with the Hesperia Recreation and Park District made a return visit for part two of his three part series on the History of Hesperia, this time for the years 1900-1950.

Delving into the 1900's, two families that are part of Hesperia's history were the Hedricks and the Walters clans. In 1912, Frank

Columbus Hedrick, as the lead water installer, made his mark by taking the original 14" water pipe and adding a 30" pipe from the Spillway to Lime Street Park, giving Hesperia the water flow the area needed. The Walters family was special, as they opened one of the first general stores, "The Walters Store" in 1914.

The White Hotel in Hesperia was unique due to its other name, "The White Disease". This was because people came to his hotel to heal from tuberculosis in part due to our dryer climate.

Speaking of hotels, Griz shared the reason for closing of the Hesperia Hotel in 1926. During his presentation he showed a 1912 AAA Road Map when the only route was on the old National

Highway, right where the hotel was located. In just a few years, Route 66 was opened and very few people used the old highway and with less travelers, left the hotel with no other option, but to close.

In 1926 the Stratton family built a structure on Main Street between 2nd and 3rd, which served as a destination type stop, run by Leroy Stratton. This building still stands

today and is the third oldest building in Hesperia. It is now home to the Hesperia Museum.

Griz shared a photo from 1936, from the Bear Valley Road Bridge, which runs over the Mojave River going in and out of Jess Ranch. The photo was a collapsed bridge with a car half-deep in water due to a major flood, when we had over 50" of rain fall within 4 days that year.

Going into the 1940's is when the Tatum family came to add their piece of history. The clan were White Rose Potato farmers out of the Lake Perris area and farmed not only the Mesa but throughout Hesperia, even running cattle across Hwy 395!

Here is a great piece of trivia for you. Did you know that the area what we now know as the Hesperia Target Shopping Center used to be a fueling station and landing strip for Tri-Motor airplanes!

Finally, Old Town Griz teased that 1950's began another chain of events that shaped the Hesperia we know today, but the Club will have to wait until he returns again to find out.

Thanks to everyone who came out this week to hear from the Griz once again and find out more about the rich history of our beloved Hesperia! I know I am looking forward to his final visit soon.




