Normally we have one guest speaker at our weekly meetings but this week we had five! Joining VVC Research Professor Dr. Lisa Harvey, P.h.D. were students from her research team, Jesse Lopez, Alicia Verley and Thea McCleign. The 5th participant was a beautiful bloodhound named Bugatti, who helps head up the research.

The team is currently studying three specific areas; first the use of Bloodhounds by law enforcement and government agencies.

first area is the continuing research human scent find missing or criminals The team heading up this area does not know who even bloodhound the

independent person is selected and hiding somewhere around the VVC campus. Bugatti's job, without a sight or hint, just a scent, will search and track down the person on campus. Their main area of focus is what is it about the human scent that Bloodhounds can detect in individuals.

The second area of study is Arson Research. Lighting wood with rags or butane to see if the dogs can detect a person's scent even after its turned to ash. The findings

are showing that they can! They are now used by the Fire Department to catch arsonists.

The third area of study this year is in the study of Autism. Many children with Autism go missing and the team is studying why children not on medication have a much higher percentage of being located by the Bloodhounds over ones who are on meds. The team feels there is something in the medication that changes the scent of the person, and that is why there is a much lower success rate.

Dr. Lisa Harvey has been working with this unique program for 20 years and has been working with law enforcement agencies, including the FBI and Beau of Land Management for over 30 years.

The next area of research for the team will be looking at the notion of "Fear Scent", and whether it is real or not. A lot of defense attorney's get their client's off, because they claim the only reason the Bloodhounds detected them was because they are afraid of dogs and put off this scent of fear. The team is working to prove or disprove the theory.
