# THE FUTURE OF MOVING THE HIGH DESERT

It has been three decades since Victor Valley Transit Authority (VVTA) commenced its services in the Victor Valley area. Starting with the provision of Meals on Wheels in Victorville and evolving into the extensive



public transportation system we have today, boasting over 30 routes, including the 11th largest vanpool in the nation, known as iVanpool. Their array of services also includes direct access ADA service, a commuter route catering to employees and military personnel commuting to Ft. Irwin, which starts at the early hour of 4:00 each morning, and their latest addition, Micro-Link, their micro-transit service.

To commemorate their 30th anniversary, Victor Valley Transit held a kickoff event on October 20th, which featured various notable guests, including Assemblyman **Juan Carrillo**, the Mayors of Adelanto, Barstow, and Victorville, along with representatives from other elected and city officials. The highlight of the event was the official proclamation from the San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors, declaring that every October 20th for the next five years will be officially recognized as

"Victor Valley Transit Day" in the County.

While recounting the agency's historical journey, **Chris Ackerman**, Victor Valley Transit PIO and Senior Marketing Manager, emphasized the importance of

looking towards the future. He invited **Stuart Geltman** from Transportation Management & Design, Inc. (TMD) to the stage. Stuart and his team are currently conducting a Comprehensive Operational Analysis (COA) in the community, seeking thoughts, comments, and ideas from Rotarians about the next decade of public transportation in the Victor Valley.

Their COA initiative began a few weeks ago with a survey involving over 400 passengers to determine the most frequently used routes and the reasons for choosing public transportation. This data will influence service adjustments; routes with low passenger numbers, like Route 42, may see reduced frequency, while popular routes could see increased service times.

**Bill Edwards** raised concerns about the need to improve transportation access for seniors aged 60 and above. In response, Chris discussed upcoming enhancements to the Micro-Link service, which will extend its reach to senior occupied mobile home parks in north Apple Valley.

Rotarians also proposed other suggestions, such as the need for more frequent service in Spring Valley Lake and the creation of direct access lines to accommodate Brightline and the new Victor Valley College Stadium.
