The Rotary Club of Victorville had a very special visitor this week, a Dutch Sheppard by the name of Nina, the newest addition to the San Bernardino County Sheriff Department!

Back in the 80's, the Sheriff's Department began using canines for search & rescue, and over the years has grown in the use of dogs for drug detection and much more. Even the Bomb/Arson Unit has a dog. Sheriff Captain and Rotarian **John Wickum** gave an introduction to their latest acquisition.

Previously, we met Raider, a Search & Rescue canine some years ago at a Rotary meeting. Since that time Raider is now retired from service. Due to this it was time to find a replacement, one who

could assist in searching for missing persons as well as criminals. They also wanted to find a dog who could hunt for guns in homes, airports and packages. From there they found Nina.

Office **Joe Carrol** began his career in Barstow, but has been at the Victorville Station for the past three years and is the handler and keeper of Nina. She was bred in Hungary, and trained in the Netherlands, before coming to the United States to meet and work with Officer Carrol for a few weeks to make sure they were compatible together. After that the training begins before she was put into service.

So far Nina has recovered 65 firearms, and over 1,000 rounds of ammunition! She has made searching for weapons much easier, as criminals are getting smarter in hiding firearms. With great scent detection, Nina is also a wonderful replacement for Raider. She is the only gun detection dog in the High Desert. Her olfactory skills are so good that she can be used in bomb and drug detection too. Thank you to Captain John Wickum, Officer Carrol and Lieutenant **Manle Pederson** for introducing us to Lady Nina.
