# **Watching the Airplanes Coming in...**

Sometimes we forget just how much business is being handled over at SCLA, and this week Craig Garrick, the president and CEO of ComAV, told us how much international business is done at his hanger.

The cost of an airplane is over \$340 million, so most



airplanes are leased, and the owners of these planes are usually banks or large corporations. ComAV helps the leasing companies

by managing the aircrafts, recovery and make necessary adjustments to help in the re-deployment of aircraft after the lease has ended.

ComAV is broken up between 2 divisions, Technical Services and Asset Management. The Technical company handles short and long-term aircraft and engine storage and preservation, transitional maintenance, light and heavy maintenance, off-site aircraft recovery and end-of-

life airframe disassembly. The Asset Management division handles such things as the maximization of the value of surplus assets, sales of surplus components, the sale or lease of surplus engines and repairs or modifications of engines to increase the planes value. With the asset management division ComAV will sometimes work directly with the airlines, whereas with the technical division, most of their work is done with the aircraft owner/leasing company. Some of their clients include, Boeing, FedEx, British Airways, United, GE Aviation, Delta and more.

One of the most interesting aspects shared by Craig is their work on the installation of Missile Defense Systems on commercial aircraft! Some of their clients include the King of Saudi Arabia and the Counselor of Germany, who has had 4 planes fitted by ComAV! To have these defense systems

#### **An Update from Ensenada**



We were honored this week to be joined by our friends from the Rotary Club in Ensenada, Mexico. In attendance were Daniel Veva, Octtavo Sanchez Ramonetti and Octavio Chavez, who gave us an update on what is happening with Rotary south of the border.

The Ensenada Rotary Club was founded in 1936 and next year celebrates their 80th anniversary and are partnered with, as well as actively working with, their sponsored ROTARACT Club.

One of their main events is their annual Christmas baskets. Their goal this year is to deliver no less than 500 baskets to families in need. Their other main project, as we are aware, is the water tanks. In the past the water problem was mainly in the outskirts of the city, but now is a general problem with water services sometimes being shut off for 10 days in the city! The Club is focusing on providing water tanks for local schools, who sometimes have to close for up to 4 days due to drought issues. It is important for all to support this project because most of the schools don't have the infrastructure to store enough water.

The Ensenada Rotary Club is also active in School Literacy programs and the Drive Safe Program. This program reaches over 5,000 students and 300 teachers, providing information on safe driving as well as Rotary and Rotaract.

For the 80th anniversary next year, there will be lots of special events, including a Gala event. Our Club will be spending time down there in 2016 to help them celebrate.
