The Rotary Club of Victorville was privileged to have San Bernardino County's 1st District Supervisor Robert Lovingood as speaker this week. Robert has been a member of the Club for approximately 20 years, and he updated members on highlights of his first year on the S. B. County Board of Supervisors.

His philosophy is simple: "When we create jobs, we create revenue to expand public safety and improve critical infrastructure which will lead to the recovery of our schools and communities." Robert is proud that his office reaches out to the community, and is listening and responsive, and commended Garner Morris for being a great community advocate for the high desert and surrounding areas.

One of the issues his office is currently addressing is the solar moratorium. Location is the most important aspect of placing solar equipment, and Robert feels residents have the right to object to the devaluation of their

property. Improvements have already been made with the addition of new mitigations. Also, over \$100,000 in unclaimed property taxes have been returned to taxpayers by diligently working to locate the recipients. Robert stated they are also working aggressively with the municipal governments towards better economics for our District. The "County Plan" looks at the things that will bring economic improvement, and he is hoping for additional funding for just those things... transportation, public safety, and improvement of the infrastructure.

Robert stressed the point that there will be a major shortage of critical trades as workers are retiring. The training component for future employees is the key, he feels. His office has identified those workers this will address, and is creating a training program for that sector of the workforce, which will be economically prudent.

While Robert supported the part-time initiative, he admits the job's minimum hourly requirement is presently 55-60 hours per week (apology to his wife Melanie for that).


