S.B. County Sheriff Rod Hoops on Prison Realignment



Sheriff Hoops began his career with the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department in 1978 and has served in numerous facets of the Department. He was appointed Sheriff on February 3, 2009, to complete the term of Sheriff Gary Penrod. He stated there has been much misinformation regarding prison realignment, or Assembly Bill 109, so offered facts to set the record straight.

The state of California and our Governor passed AB109, which basically puts non-violent, non-sexual, and non-serious offenders into the local jails to do their time, rather than in state prison. Our jails are completely full. So beginning October 1st, around 300 people per month will be released back into the community; some with ankle bracelets or other monitoring devices. Coincidentally, an FBI report recently released showed San Bernardino County has a population of 40,558 gang members, the third-largest gang population in the nation! Although prison realignment is too new for officials to know whether it will result in a gang influx, we can pretty much guess that outcome, and creates a


dilemma for the Criminal Justice System and the people of our community.

According to Sheriff Hoops, The S.B. County leadership responsible for prison realignment are working together toward a successful transition, and if you are interested in reading more about the plan, the San Bernardino

Sheriff Hoops stated a few times that, "the county can house people in county jails cheaper than they can in state prisons, as long as the money is available".

Ryan McEachron introduced guest speaker Sheriff Rod Hoops, and hoped the topic would keep us awake!




IT'S A WINNER!!


