#### November 9, 2021 BURYING THE DEAD WHILE TRYING TO SAVE THE LIVING

It was one year ago that the flood gates opened at Desert View Funeral Home and Memorial Park, as shared this week by General Manager **Allen Williams**. It was during this time that Covid deaths went through the roof.

Pre-Covid, while the Funeral Home received a few calls per day from families looking to cremate or bury a loved one, all of a sudden they were fielding 20-25 calls per day! With this many calls coming in on a daily basis, Allen needed to close

up Desert View for two main reasons. The first reason was to protect their staff, and second was because they needed to turn the funeral home into a morgue. They had so many bodies due to Covid-19, they had to buy saw horses and plywood to stack them up. When Corporate offered to send Allen a refrigerator truck, he told them they would need to send a whole fleet, as they could fill a whole truck in one day!

They kept up by running their cremating services 24/7 and hold burial services all day long. Burial services became only graveside services, with no viewings or chapel services. They only allowed ten people at each service and had to stay 20 ft. away from staff. Desert View's sister funeral homes would send Allen 12-15 cremations per

day which made their job even harder. In the end, for the first time in Allen's career, he had to tell families, "No", as there weren't enough hours in the day to take care of their backlog.

The industry itself was also thrown in a mess. Casket making companies went from receiving a couple of calls per day from many funeral homes around the country to build caskets, to the same amount of companies now ordering 20 per day.

After 4-5 months, things slowly began to go back to normal, due to people protecting themselves and others by getting vaccinated. Since vaccinations became widely available, it was almost like the Covid faucet was shut off. As the community reopened Desert View began getting back to normal, with more car crash deaths, suicides and homicides over Covid-19 deaths. Currently they take about 1-2 calls a day from a Covid death, and all are from unvaccinated people...None from people who have been vaccinated. Allen predicts Covid will be around for many years in one way over another.

To conclude, Allen shared one piece of important information. If a loved one passes away due to Covid , as long as you have the Death Certificate lists Covid as main cause or contributory of death and the report from the Funeral Home, FEMA will cover the whole cost of the cremation or burial. Allen has seen many family members change their minds about getting the vaccine once a loved one dies, but sadly, many still follow the disinformation train that people buy into.

Thank you Allen for sharing your insights, as hard as some of it was to hear, and doing your part to not only put the dead to rest, while trying to save the ones who are still alive.


