

Republican Assemblyman Tim Donnelly came to California at the age of 19, and fell in love with our state and "the land of opportunity".

Tim grew up in a family of 14 children and worked at the family business following college before he opened his own manufacturing business in California. Prior to becoming an Assemblyman, he founded the largest Minuteman chapter in California, working to secure our border with Mexico.

Over-regulation in California is a major issue; it is appalling that in one week there were 805 new laws signed into legislation by our Governor. Tim feels that over-government is the greatest threat to our freedom; that government is the fastest growing industry in the country, and this growth is completely unsustainable.

As a business owner for twenty years, Tim feels the pressure the state of California puts on business, and works toward lessening the burden on business.

As a bit of good news, Tim reported on the overturning of a recently passed law that had us all scratching our heads. The people organized and obtained 620,000 signatures that pressured the Governor into repealing the law that was passed allowing boys into girls' rest rooms in elementary schools. Tim called this a "bonehead" law, and is encouraged that people are standing up against the

"tsunami" of Sacramento and over-government.

Tim's web site states: "In the Legislature, Tim has earned the reputation of a conservative who holds steadfast to his beliefs: fighting illegal immigration, defending public safety, removing restrictions on business growth, and protecting the taxpayers' pocketbooks."
