THE BUILDING OF SCLA

If you have driven though SCLA over the last couple of years, it is barely recognizable to what it was back in the mid 90's. That is what **Dougal Agan**, co-founder of Stirling Development has done to that piece of land. In 1998 Stirling began working with the City of Victorville to take a look at the former George Air Force Base. Dougal and Stirling Development have made it into the giant industrial landscape we see now.

Since 2005, the area has gone from zero uses to now over 63 million sf of available industrial complex! They created infrastructure new and now SCLA is 100% occupied and leased, with 2.5 billion used to build new facilities and over 5,000 jobs.

Of the 63 million sf, only 4.2 million have been used thus far so there is a lot of room to grow! To put it into a better perspective, 2 million sf are used in just the entrance alone and the whole area could fit 75 football fields!

As Rotarians most of us know about ComAV and a few other companies at SCLA, but there are more corporate giants who have taken residence at the facility, due to the feasibility of expansion. These companies include Boeing, Dr. Pepper/Snapple, GE, Pratt & Whitney, Newell Rubbermaid, Fastenal, Sparkles Water, Red Bull, Solar City and Fed Ex.

They are a major distribution hub with custom buildings made for Plastipak, which continues to expand operations year after year. They even have facilities for smaller companies, with areas of 3,000 - 6,000 sf. There are also 34 acres being used to stage 21,000 pre-owned Volkswagen and Audi cars. While the decision is being made whether to retrofit, recycle or sell the cars to other countries, they are housed out in the middle of SCLA.

In the immediate future, Stirling will demo existing run down structures like old barracks, dorms and apartments to make way for a new wave of buildings. The company protects how they invest their money but at the same time, are very excited for future developments and companies that will be coming in. They are now targeting companies in the LA basin that have quite frankly run out of room to grow and need a place like the Southern California Logistics Airport to expand their operations.
