MR. SMITTY GOES TO SACRAMENTO

Our Club was honored to receive a visit this week from 33rd District Assemblyman Thurston "Smitty" Smith, former owner of Smitty's Concrete Pumping. Smitty also served time as a Director with the Mojave Water Agency and three terms as the Mayor of Hesperia.

Smitty was elected as our Assemblyman in November 2020 following Jay Obernolte's election to Congress and just finished his first year legislative session. In the Assembly, there

are 80 members. 60 are Democrats, 19 are Republicans, and one Independent, which makes it a truly one-party ruled state. Smitty authored two Bills this session, both aimed for Veterans. The first one would allow for a 50% discount for any Veteran starting up a new business, and the second would add a Veteran Status symbol on their Drivers License. Both died in committee, because Smitty wouldn't support another Assemblywoman's Bill. He also worked with other members of the legislature to pass AB 359, which makes reciprocity for doctors easier between California and other states. This was signed by the governor last month. Smitty also took the time to share some very bad Bills that were very anti-business and anti

law enforcement come through.

Once such Bill that thankfully died was SB359. It would have created a pilot program to tax drivers for the miles driven to force zeroemission vehicle purchases. More electrical cars would mean less gas tax revenue so they wanted to charge for the miles driven to make up the cost.

Another Bill, AB 1346 would require small motor equipment like lawn mowers, chainsaws and leaf blowers to be electric only by 2024. If someone uses a landscaper, they would have

to plug into the homeowner's house to provide their services.

Another Bill that died on the floor would require a tax on guns and ammunition. Smitty's argument that people who legally buy guns and ammo don't commit crimes with them, it is the people who steal them, so why would you put a tax on the ones who are not using them for nefarious purposes?

As one might be aware, the Joshua Tree is currently a candidate species under the California Endangered Species Act as of October 9, 2020. In February of this year, there was a court hearing in Fresno County that rejected efforts by the City of Hesperia and the California Construction and Industrial Materials Association to remove the Joshua Tree from "candidate status." The California Fish and Game Commission is going to be reviewing the petition from the Center for Biological Diversity and developing their own report by April 9, 2022.

Finally Smitty spoke about the Inflation. Prices are 5.4% higher this September than at the same time last year. In fact, an economist at Moody's said that the average U.S. household is paying an additional \$175 per month for basic necessities. It's basically a hidden tax increase. Smitty promises to continue to fight for businesses, Veterans and water issues throughout the State.
