For Boomers about 1/5 are renters, the median monthly rent is \$945, 50% have previously owned a home and are not looking to buy another home. \$1075, and only 12% have previously owned a home, while 98% are expected to buy a home. But the question becomes, what type of home are Millennials looking for? For Boomers houses have always been the draw, big, large houses and wide, outside open spaces to be exact. Millennials, on the other hand, want to live in homes that have a lot of open space inside of them. They love the idea of one great room instead of a living room and kitchen separately. If you sell your home to a Millennial, expect walls to be torn down! They also want a place to walk where it is easy and convenient for shopping. More and more of these people choose not own cars but to use companies like Uber instead. They also are looking for homes with a strong Wifi signal, since most of their entertainment viewing is done streaming over the Internet. Along with Eco friendly material in the home, like bamboo floors, they are also searching for great open kitchens and well designed homes.
