

#### **TEACHER MINI GRANTS**

There are some great, innovative minds right here in the High Desert. They are our local teachers, as we found out this week at our annual Teacher Mini Grant Program. In total, 43 grants were awarded, over \$12,000 for great programs, that will be used in the classroom to engage students and make learning exciting. Rotarian **Alicia Anderson** from Excelsior emceed the proceedings.

Beginning with Excelsior, a variety of programs were awarded, including the NHS (National Honor Society) Group Community Service Project in where 57 honor roll students will create bags of items for our area homeless, which will then be distributed by the Victor Valley Rescue Mission. Another program, called "Getting to Know Your High Desert", will have volunteers from the Hesperia Museum teach the History class, the art of making bricks; the same bricks used to make the first Hesperia hotel.

Over at Helendale Elementary teacher **Eric Carmichael** will use his grant to piggyback the one he received from our Club last year. In 2018 he received funds to make garden boxes, and this year he will use the money to make boxes, which will effectively create a greenhouse out of gardening boxes, so the classes can work during the winter months. Another program, "Forces Around Us", will focus on magnetism building.



for learning, while over at Endeavour, the program, "Take Me Out to the Q Ball" will have students use a large Q Ball with a microphone inside to throw around the classroom where students will speak the answers to math problems into the ball. A great example of student and teacher engagement. At Galileo, they will use their grant to teach about the history of great women.

Puesta del Sol will have a "Library for Everyone". Right along side our ReadB4K Program, we know a lot of our students don't have any books to read at home due to financial issues. The Grant will allow teacher **Amber Pattie** to buy enough books, so each student will have a library of 12 books to keep for themselves at home.

Speaking of Read B4K, down the road at West Palms Conservatory, teacher **Jenet Whitman**, with her funding, will be providing a safe haven for those who may be too ashamed because they don't know how to read.

The last District our Club awarded grants to this year were schools within the VVUHSD. Honorary Rotarian **Nancy Noble** will use her Grant to allow students to put their Power Point Presentations onto their cell phones for review at Hook Jr. High, and at Silverado, **Janette Gomez**, who teaches Autistic students, will use her funding to buy art supplies for her art therapy program. Lastly, at VVHS instructor **Eric Arthurton** will teach students using the game of Petanque, the French version of Bocce Ball for teaching and interactive learning.

There are many people to thank for making this year's Teacher Mini Grant Program such a success.
