

#### November 21, 2023 THE DECEPTIVE LIES OF BIG PHARMA

The Pharmacist was back. **Curt Emick** joined the Club again this week about the drug crisis in America today. As a pharmacist for 45 years, Curt is extremely passionate about the opioid crisis and has devoted his life to exposing the truth about these dangerous drugs.

While his focus last time was on the synthetic opioid Fentanyl, and this time began his talk on OxyContin. Oxy was introduced in 1996 and in its first year on the market had sales

of 48 million and in 2000 jumped to 1.2 billion! There were 670,000 prescriptions written in 1996 and over 14 million written in 2001 and 2002 combined. Part of the rise was due to a deceptive lie from Purdue that said there was only a 1% addiction rate with their drug. That was because they were purposely basing it on a study of hospitalized people taking it for 3 days after cancer treatments. In addition, primary care doctors were prescribing it to non-cancer pain patients. By 2003 nearly half of all physicians prescribing OxyContin were primary care physicians. In 2022 there were 106,999 OxyContin overdose deaths in the United States alone!

Another drug touched on was Xylazine, which goes by the street of "Tranq". People are now using it as a drug, which is used as a sedative and muscle relaxer for dogs, cats, horses and other animals! This drug can cause bradycardia, hypo-tension, and depression to the central nervous system and repository tract.

Have you heard that Cannabis (Marijuana) and CBD are non-additive and actually good for you? Another big lie. Adults as well as children are

using Cannabis and CBD products daily in such items as foods, oils, lotions, gummies, capsules and even cosmetics as they are told it treats pain, depression, insomnia and many other symptoms. Here is the truth.

Cannabis use disorder is a medical condition in which a person is unable to stop using marijuana despite it causing health and social problems in their life. Psychosis is another severe medical condition in which thoughts and emotions are affected that contact is lost with external reality.

General side effects of using CBD include liver damage, interference with other medicines, drowsiness, diarrhea, mood swings, irritability and reduction in male testosterone.

In drug use among college students, marijuana is king with 32.6% as active users. Right behind in with 13% is cocaine and hallucinogens!

The Club is currently raising money


