

Activating the Emergency Operations Center

This week **Dan Munsey** took us to the Emergency Operations Center, located in Hesperia, which covers the desert region of San Bernardino County. The location the Club met at for our off-site is their secondary location, with the main office in Rialto. The reason for two locations is quite simple, the Cajon Pass. An earthquake, fire, flood or even a major traffic accident could cut us off from county assistance, so having a separate center is imperative to handle emergencies here in our High Desert.

Cindy Serrano, the Assistant Manger is in charge of the day-to-day operations, along with her boss. The E.O.C.'s mission is to strengthen county-wide emergency management capabilities to ensure protection of life and property before, during and after disasters. Before a disaster hits, Cindy and her staff look at any incident, such as a fire, and look at the path, homes, weather, and other such circumstances to determine whether to label it a disaster and then go into action. The area they cover is vast; 24 cities, over 60 unincorporated communities and over 20,000 square miles of desert landscape. Not only do they have to deal with the Cajon Pass and desert, but also mountain terrains, wind factors, and the San Andreas Fault!

The Response Team gathers intelligence and planning through resource requests in the region and state, as well as set up shelters and ICP's, Incident Command Posts. They also take care of damage estimates, and repopulation efforts after a disaster strikes.

There is also a huge outreach from the Center into our own community to take part in helping during a crisis. In the recent fires, both our local Home

Depot and VVTA took a major role to help displaced residents have a place to go, and allow them to get the services they desperately needed.

Luckily, disasters are few and far between, but as we saw during the Blue Cut Fire, when it does happen the Emergency Operations Center is ready and prepared to handle the situation. Next time, your TV show or radio station is interrupted by those famous words, "This is a test of the Emergency Broadcast System..", You will know they are hard at work to help our community prepare.
