THE LEGACY OF MIDWAY HOME SOLUTIONS: PART 1

Midway Home Solutions has been an iconic business in the High Desert for many years. While this year it was sold and changed into a Howard's Appliance Store, **Don Lager** and his family have left their mark and are an inspiration to many who want to go into business for themselves.

The story begins when the Lager family arrived to Victorville by train way back in 1951. Their first house was on Sunset Drive where Don's dad began repairing appliances.

He had a 3 year contract with George Air Force Base. Every service member had their own washer and dryer and it was his dad who was responsible for maintaining them. In 1959 the family moved to Midway Street in Victorville and during this time his Dad worked part time on appliance repairs and self taught himself the ins and outs of appliances and refrigeration. After the contract ended and he was left with no job, his father decided to open his own store from an old hamburger stand, leased for \$75 per month. That was the beginning of Midway Home Solutions.

From the start, all of the children held positions in the company. They were a Whirlpool franchise but also carried the Norge line of appliances. It was soon after that the family was hit with a one-two

punch. First Whirlpool pulled their franchise deal, and they solved that by striking a deal with Maytag. The second challenge was that they simply ran out of room at their first location, so they needed to move.

In 1964 they moved to the Victor Valley Shopping Center, as that was the place to be! Families from Barstow and Big Bear would come to the center to do all their shopping, so it seemed like a big win for the Lager family. It wasn't but a few more years

that they outgrew that place and moved again, this time renting the Victorville Glass building on Seventh Street.

Don was eager to move on and become his own boss, so in 1976 he and Pam (whom he married in 1970) bought the business from his parents. Don approached Contel Phone Company President **Jim Miles** about buying the 2.5 acres on La Paz Dr. They worked a deal and Pontious build them a 25k concrete tilt up and moved in December 27, 1990. Only one problem, due to a 3 month cold snap, nobody left their homes so business dried up! As luck would have it, due to the weather not getting higher than the teens, most homes in the High Desert were faced with broken water vales and hoses, so **Pam Lager** went down to Los Angeles to buy all she could, and they became a repair company again to survive those three months until the weather warmed up and business came back.

They continued to bring in new brands, but they needed more to grow. Unfortunately former Rotarian and competitor **Al Castalucci** closed his business, Midway picked up the Mitsubishi television line he specialized in and boy did they sell! Now people just needed something to sit in to watch their televisions.
