The Two Mark's spoke this week. What we mean is **Mark Creffield** from the Victor Valley Chamber of Commerce and **Mark Austin** from



C-Me Promotions. Both gentlemen shared information about the upcoming Greater High Desert Chamber of Commerce, which will house four Chambers (Victor Valley, Apple Valley, Hesperia and Adelanto) into one.

The process began with an idea 10-12 years ago, but the time wasn't right. About 3-4 years ago the idea came up again and with Mark serving as CEO of both the Victor Valley and Hesperia Chambers (*Hesperia had previously taken control of the Adelanto Chamber*), the time seemed right. After a visit with both the Riverside and Coachella Valley Chambers, who had done similar models, a plan was set and for the past 10 months, this idea of a Chamber merger has become a reality. Imagine four businesses becoming one conglomerate, and then out of that, having four separate locations.

There are many benefits for members of the Greater High Desert Chamber of Commerce. For starters, instead of paying for separate Chamber memberships, there will be only one, with all

the benefits of being members of all four. Resources, services, programs and events will be streamlined, the region will have a much bigger voice

for business advocacy at the State Capital as well as locally, and more opportunities for networking and referrals.

The GHDCC Board of Directors will consist of 16 members, 4 from each current Chamber Board. Mark Austin will service as Chairman for it's inaugural year. The remaining board members from area Chambers will transition to Business Councils for the areas they serve.

Before all of this comes to fruition, Chamber members must approve to allow for changes in their own Bylaws. Both Victor Valley and Apple Valley must have members vote, and for Hesperia and Adelanto, the Board has the power to choose, but their memberships highly endorsed the change and Victor Valley Chamber members voted almost unanimously. Apple Valley is still in the voting process. Currently, the Chambers of Commerce in Barstow and Phelan have declined to participate, but Lucerne Valley has shown interest.

The goal is to have everything up and going in January of 2021, and then a further 9 months of "growing pains", to work everything out. For more information go to vvchamber.com
