Habitat for Humanity is a global nonprofit housing organization working in nearly 1,400 communities across the United States and in approximately 70 countries around the world. Habitat works in partnership with people and families in need of a decent and affordable home by



building a modest 3-4 bedroom home in communities. The house is first sold before being built, when an affordable mortgage plan is set up. Volunteers are then put to the task of building the home. The buyer must also put in 500 hours of work on the project itself to qualify.

Tony will head up one of these homes which will be built next spring in Hesperia. In the meantime he has partnered with local high schools and now has a class of 25 high school students which meet on Thursday evenings for classroom learning on construction basics as well as a 7' x 14' practice house on campus. Working on this project shows the students that this type of career choice really matters, as well as the satisfaction of a completed working structure.

"Between our local high schools, Victor Valley College and Habitat for Humanity, all areas of the 4-Way test are covered." said Tony to our Club Tuesday afternoon.

In upcoming weeks and months at Victor Valley College there will be a building competition between local high schools, a construction scholarship program and in the summer of 2017, a 6-week Construction Academy will be held for certifications.

Tony says that most high schoolers love to work and build things, and this is a perfect match for those students.
