GANGS, REALIGNMENT AND THE 3-STRIKES LAW CHANGE



The Rotary Club of Victorville welcomed Sam Bernardino County's District Attorney, Mike Ramos, who addressed important issues within the County, and introduced the new Deputy District Attorney, Mary Asly. Mike restated his office's commitment to crimes involving domestic violence and crimes against elders and children, the most vulnerable in our communities. The good news, Mike stated, is that of three propositions brought to vote in this past election, two will impact us positively. Proposition 34 was not won without a

fight, and 724 death row inmates were <u>almost</u> released back into the general public. Proposition 35's vote increased the sentence for human trafficking and

allowed for more money to fight this crime, which is becoming rampant in California. The vote was an overwhelming 81%.

Unfortunately, the change in the 3-Strikes law (Proposition 36) will impact us negatively, and is retroactive. About 500 criminals qualify, and will be re-sentenced, released, and put back on our streets. Mike tells us his office is ready and will closely monitor these released criminals, but there is hard work ahead.

Mike is the President of the California District Attorney's Association and sits on the Board of the National District Attorney's Association; we can be sure we're in good hands. Thank you, Mike, for attending and updating Rotary on these issues!
