

HOW WASTEWATER WORKS

Wastewater is much more than what comes from the toilet, as was shared by Rotarian and VVWRA General Manger, **Darron Poulsen** this week. Wastewater includes water from our sink, showers, dishwashers and washing machines. Basically anything that goes down the sewer pipe. The wastewater comes from homes and businesses in Victorville,

The Victor Valley Wastewater Reclamation Authority began treating wastewater in 1981 and was originally part of the Mojave Water Agency. Today their plants treat 12 million gallons of wastewater per day and 100,000 gallons of waste sludge and food waste are digested daily which produces that renewable natural gas.

The first part of the process is to get rid of the big things like toys, sticks, flushable wipes, and other objects that do not decompose. The next step to rid the water of "heavies" such as dirt, sand and grit. From there the treatment starts, slowing the water flow and adding chemicals to create bacteria to cause the biologicals and heavies to sink to the bottom and be scraped away. From there the water is treated and used for a variety of reasons such as vegetation, golf courses or to the Mojave River to assist other communities.

VVWRA is proud to serve the residents and businesses of the Victor Valley by providing wastewater treatment, water recycling, renewable green energy, and nutrient-rich soil amendments. They have been providing those services for more than 40 years. As part of their mission, VVWRA is committed to protecting public health and the environment. They do that with a dedicated spirit of integrity and collaboration with the community and other member agencies.
