He also served 5 years as Mayor and 26 years as a Council Member for the City of Victorville. Among the many Boards Terry has served on, for 12 years he was on

the Lahontan Region of the State Regional Water Quality Control Board, and three years as Chairman. Of course, no proper introduction would be complete without mentioning his 57 years as a Rotarian!

"With 3 votes you can do anything in Victorville," stated Terry at the meeting. As the City Council is set up that way, many great advancements have happened, and sadly some opportunities



Jessica Perez asked how confident Terry was in the new City Council. Terry shared that the Council of the last several years has been sharply divided, but he hopes that the new Council with Mayor **Debra Jones** will become stronger, and with the power of 3, many positive things will happen for the City.

Jon Hove asked where Terry sees the future for the Southern California Logistics Airport (SCLA), and it was shared that as our regional and

national economy continues to grow, so will SCLA. Along with the second largest paved runway, more and more goods are moving through the airport, which also serves as a full customs portal. This is a huge advantage over going through LAX and other regional airports. There is also a lot of room for expansion with thousands of acres that is available for development there, but anything can change with just 3 votes.

Many more topics were covered including **Mike Page** asking about the origins and future of the Mojave River-walk, **Chris Ackerman** on Advanced Directives and **David North** asking about Wills and Trusts. Terry shared that people should do both Wills and Trusts, and now it is more important to do them as soon as possible because there are too many people going into the hospital due to Covid and not coming out.


