BUILDING STRONG FOUNDATIONS

The Victor Elementary School District has a mission to build strong foundations for all of their students throughout the Victorville area, and in 2020 they will continue on this foundation and deal with the issue of overcrowding as well as school safety with Measure D on the ballot. This week we heard from VESD PIO Eric Camarena and Assistant Superintendent of Business Services Debbie Betts on the issue.

The High Desert is growing and so are our schools. Overcrowding makes it harder for students to learn and reduces the amount of time teachers can spend with students. Many of our area schools are at or over capacity, with some serving more than 900 students.

VESD needs to build to help alleviate this issue and ensure a quality learning environment that supports science, technology, engineering, arts and math instruction, so all students are prepared for success in high school, college and careers.

As you see on the news monthly, school safety is a growing threat across the nation. We need to improve school security and

provide secure campuses where students are protected. The

needs of school facilities exceed what can be funded from the District's budget without making cuts elsewhere, and the State provides very limited funding for school facility improvements.

According to Eric, Measure D will improve student safety and campus security systems, install security hardware to provide secure campuses and prevent access during an emergency.

Finally, it will allow them to construct classrooms and school facilities to relieve overcrowding and support high quality construction. Along with that, there will be strict fiscal accountability including a project list, independent citizen's oversight committee and annual audits. All measure D funds must stay local to support Victorville students and cannot be taken away by the State. Measure D will also ensure that no money can be used for administrator's salaries or benefits.

With the repayment of Measure Y complete, local property owners would pay less on tax year 2020-21 than they did in 2018-19 even with the passage of a potential bond measure. This bond measure would increase the current rate of approximately \$40 per \$100,000 of assessed value by approximately \$19 per year which would still be a lower annual rate that Victorville property owners have paid for VESD schools in the past. Simply put, the average homeowner cost per year would be \$35.


