

The 4-Way Test Belongs in the Senate

This week Senator Sharon Runner started her presentation to the Rotary Club of Victorville by stating what a good idea it would be to start every Senate meeting with a reciting of the Rotary 4-Way Test.

Sharon Runner is a businesswoman and advocate, and currently represents the 21st District in the California State Senate. A lifelong resident of California, she is proud of her roots and is dedicated to serving her community and state.

Sharon was first elected to the State Senate in 2011, representing Los Angeles, Ventura, Kern and San Bernardino counties. She was the seventh Republican woman in California's history to be elected to the State Senate.

Sharon was elected to the California State Assembly in 2002, and served as a proud and effective advocate for her constituents through 2008. Her primary focus was public safety, education, and children's issues, including the foster care and adoption community.

In her first term of office, Sharon was appointed as Assistant Republican Leader by former Republican Leader and current Congressman Kevin McCarthy. She also held key fiscal leadership positions, serving as the Vice Chair of the Appropriations Committee and as a member of the Budget Committee and Budget Subcommittee on Education.

Of her extensive list of public achievements, Sharon was the author of California's Proposition 83, or Jessica's Law, which passed with 70 percent voter approval and created the nation's toughest sex predator laws.
